







ERD 2012 Consultation Governance of Natural Resources with a focus on Land Maastricht, 18-19 May 2011

Draft Programme

Context and purpose of this Consultation

The 2012 European Report on Development (ERD), the third such report to be published by the EU, will focus on how natural resource management can promote sustainable and inclusive growth. Within this overall theme the report will depart from a contextual analysis of increasing scarcity and the effects of climate change, and will explore the actual and possible roles of public and private actors (both for-profit and non-profit) as they engage in the management of water, energy and land, resources. This WEL nexus (water-energy-land), the interactions between its three elements and the need to manage this nexus in an integrated fashion will provide the overall framework of analysis for this Report.

Chapter 4 or the ERD 2012 Report will look into **defining a** *framework for understanding the role of public and private sector in natural resource management*, while Chapter 5 will provide **specific case study analysis on** *Investment in Land.* Chapters 8 and 9 will then look in turn at the contributions the private sector (in its broadest sense) and then the public sector (at different levels) make to the governance and management of not only land but also to the other two elements of the nexus: water and energy

As part of a series of consultation events on the ERD, one event will be organised on 18 and 19 May 2011 in Maastricht, the Netherlands. The main purpose of this consultation event is to **inform the analysis and writing process for these chapters**. Various academic authors are being commissioned to write background papers for the ERD and a number of these will be invited to come and present their ideas to the consultation.

The consultation event in Maastricht will look into the governance of natural resources, and then more specifically at the area of investments in land for production and growth and issues arising from the access, management and conservation of land. In addition, both issues will be analysed in the third part of the programme in relation to the Water-Energy-Land nexus, a key part of the analytical context to be used in the Report.
