Dr. Jörg Meyer-Stamer †

30 October 1958 - 1 May 2009

This workshop is dedicated to our former colleague and good friend Dr. Jörg Meyer-Stamer. Jörg was one of the most creative and productive development researchers in Germany. He had the rare and important ability to combine meticulous research with valuable advice at the level of development projects. His research interests were driven by a strong motivation to understand development processes better and to contribute with new ideas, patching and re-configuring old insights into innovative formats and products. Jörg worked in dozens of developing countries to understand their constraints and contribute to the development of new participatory approaches aimed at strengthening local competitiveness in an inclusive and sustainable way.

Jörg continuously challenged himself and his colleagues. He had an uncommon ability to take different perspectives and to be open-minded about different perceived realities. It was not necessary to agree with him, but he encouraged new discussions, challenged traditional perceptions, and forced others to look deeper into important problems.

We were thrilled when Jörg decided to join our research project to contribute one of the country studies and to participate in developing the comparative framework of the project. However, shortly after this decision, he unexpectedly passed away on May 1, 2009 after a short struggle with a terminal illness. He was only 50 years old.

Jörg had worked at the German Development Institute from 1988 to 1996. Together with Klaus Esser, Wolfgang Hillebrand, and Dirk Messner, he developed the concept of "systemic competitiveness", which strongly influenced the discussion about economic development strategies in Germany and abroad. He then moved to Duisburg to search for a deeper and more practical understanding of industrial and economic development with a special focus on the structural change process in the Ruhr Valley. Here he led a German-Korean-Chilean research project at the Institute of Development and Peace to look at the regional economic development process in Germany from a comparative international perspective. He used the insights gained from this work to develop far-reaching economic development strategies for industrial and developing countries that also merged into his later work with mesopartner.

When Jörg founded the consulting firm *mesopartner* in 2003, he had already paved the way for business success with his experience and practical manual publications on the Participatory Appraisal of Competitive Advantage (PACA) approach. He once said that he never was interested in opening a business with employees. What he wanted was to share his knowledge and to enrich it through networking and exchanging with other international and local experts. This is a trait he shared with his partners and other colleagues as well as with more than 10,000 people who have downloaded the Local Economic Development podcast hosted by him and Shawn Cunningham during the last few years.

His untimely death represents an irreplaceable and painful loss for German development research and practice. His friends will never forget him.
