## Foreword

In 2007 the Green Forum held an event on “Climate change, a challenge for the new Millennium – Linking climate change, natural resources, livelihood and policies” and subsequently published the inventory “Climate change in Ethiopia - Who does what? An inventory of activities and expertise”. By that time, most organisations stated that they do not have activities that fit into the climate change framework. Since then and especially in the last months the landscape of organisations and institutions working on climate change related topics has changed tremendously.

The present directory therefore aims to take stock of organisations and institutions currently working on climate change related topics. The publication shall facilitate information exchange and a better coordination of actors and activities. The information provided in this directory is based on a questionnaire which was distributed between September and November 2010. All information listed here was provided by the respective organisations and institutions themselves.

The directory focuses on civil society organisations and institutions active in the field of adaptation to climate change. As the directory depends on the participation of actors and as the field is dynamic and changing throughout time, there will be more organisations working on climate change related topics which are not listed here. This particularly applies to the Wereda or Kebele level. This publication is therefore not conclusive and can only be a first step to map actors active in the field.
