Next Economy Lab (NELA) and IDOS are happy to announce the opening for the contributions to the conference "Development Beyond Growth – Global and Local Perspectives on Just Transitions".

The conference brings together practitioners and academics from the Global South and North. It focusses on whether Just Transitions that respect planetary boundaries and enhance social wellbeing require alternative forms of economic systems and development that go beyond a focus on economic growth. In addition to discussing concepts and research results, the conference will highlight best-practice examples that show what growth-independent Just Transitions could look like and what this means for adequate development cooperation in the twenty-first century.

### What we are looking for

Contributions that deal especially (but not exclusively) with the following questions:

- To what extent does the debate on economic growth and different conceptions of wellbeing differ between the Global North and the Global South?
- What spill-over effects would shifting to an economy beyond growth in the Global North have for Global South countries?
- What role should political institutions at different levels and private stakeholders play in Just Transitions towards an economy beyond growth?
- What are the main barriers to achieving an economy beyond growth?
- ➤ How can development cooperation support Just Transitions?

### How can you contribute?

We invite you to contribute with a short presentation or poster. Contributions can communicate the results of academic studies but also present practical experiences. Practitioners might, for instance, present measures that their company has taken to shift to a more sustainable business model, share experiences with a relevant development cooperation project, or describe a policy that a public institution has implemented to move beyond the current growth focused economic model.

- > All posters will be presented in a short pitch by the authors on the first afternoon
- Content of the posters may additionally also be presented in a workshop
- Presentations will be matched to one of the parallel workshop sessions
- Each workshop session will include 2-3 presentations by contributors of about 15 min., followed by discussion with participants

As we aim for different formats (including fishbowls, round-tables, presentations...), we accept and encourage inputs in a non-conventional form.
